The status area has its own extra thick border with a triangular bottom right corner. Our version has no raised border on the top side. The left, right and bottom of ours do have raised borders but they are too thin. Finally, the triangular portion in the bottom right is missing some diagonal "striping" that appears in the 4GL version.

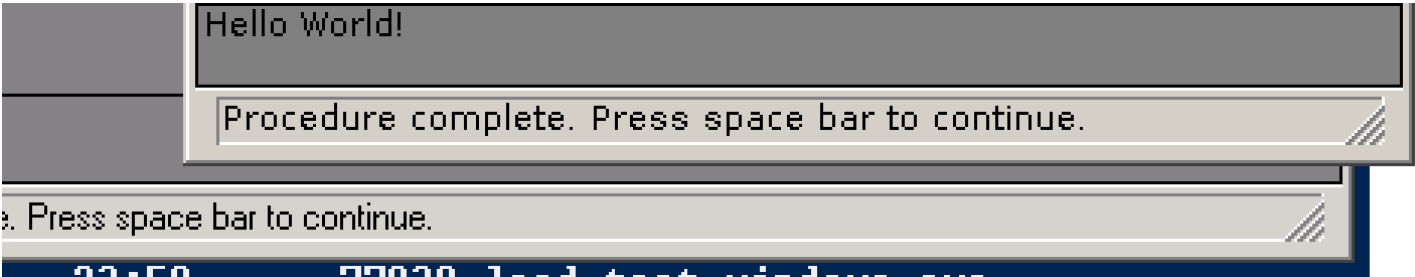

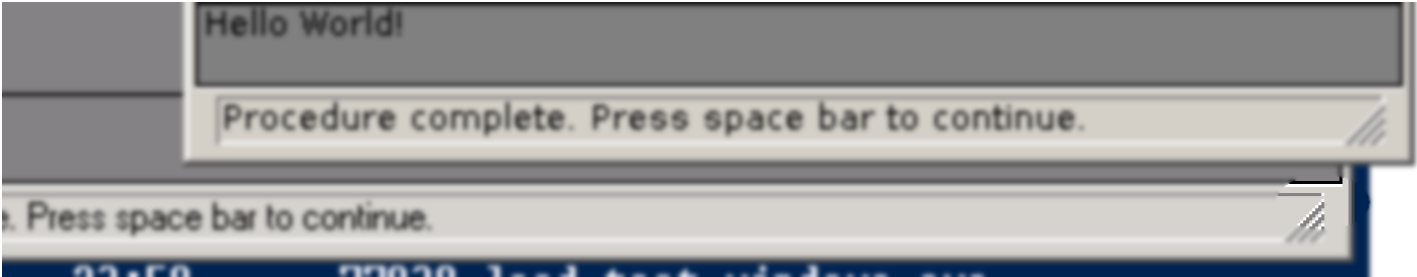

In this image, the P2J window version is above and the Progress window below. There is a single extra grey pixel drawn in the Progress version, just above the "triangle" drawing.
